



HB 219: Charter School Omnibus

Local administrators need to stop shortchanging public charter school students! <u>Contact your</u> <u>state legislator</u> and urge support for HB 219!

Key Info

- Requires **equal local funding** for public charter and public district school students
- Makes it harder for a local school district to veto a proposed public charter school
- Prohibits local school boards from discriminating against public charter students in district admissions
- Allows counties to fund public charter school buildings and facilities

Local Funding

- Public charter school students in North Carolina receive <u>37% less local funding</u> than public district school students (source: <u>BEST NC</u>).
- In 2020-21, local governments shortchanged public charter schools by over \$108 million.
- State law originally required <u>fair and equal funding</u>, and state courts ordered such. That law was changed in 2010, causing the unequal funding we see today. HB 219 reverts to the original model.
- Public school students should not have less local funding than others simply because their parents chose a public charter school.
